A Study of the "One Another's" of the New Testament (Various Scriptures)

There are 59 passages in the New Testament that directly instruct believers in Jesus Christ about living out our faith in Him in the context of Christian community. These passages use the term "one another." This is a forefront issue in the mind of Jesus and the writers of the New Testament. The refrain is inescapable. Andy Stanley observes, "The primary activity of the church was one-anothering one another." It is, therefore, reasonably necessary for us to be diligent to prioritize what the Scripture deems important. A life concerned with glorifying the God who has saved us by His grace and is interested in personal spiritual growth will focus its attention on others as prescribed in the New Testament.

This works it way out practically as a local church develop groups/circles of like-minded, outward focused Christians. These groups provide a real context for doing life together as the Scripture calls for in these "one another" passages. The circles should offer support, learning, accountability, encouragement, and confidentiality as a means for bonding the hearts and minds of believers together and providing a picture to unbelievers of genuine Christian fellowship. This study is designed to direct our attention toward this indispensable aspect of our faith. Without a group of believers to "one another" with, we are weak believers and best and, tragically, perhaps not even converted believers at all. It's just that serious.
