Packer said, “The Christian’s life in all its aspects – intellectual and ethical, devotional and relational, upsurging in worship and outgoing in witness – is supernatural; only the Spirit can initiate and sustain it. So apart from him, not only will there be no lively believers and no lively congregations, there will be no believers and no congregations at all.” God has sovereignly chosen to live within us. We must not treat this truth lightly or mismanage the privilege we have been given. This lesson is designed to revive our hearts to know and yield to Him each day of our lives.
