## EPISODE 20: "THE LAST SACRIFICE: ONE AND DONE" - HEBREWS 9:11-10:18

## CONTEXT

We'll also explore the temporal nature of Old Covenant sacrifices and contrast them with the finality of Jesus' New Covenant sacrifice.
