

EPISODE 20: "THE LAST SACRIFICE: ONE AND DONE" - HEBREWS 9:11-10:18

CONTEXT

In this episode, we are going to explore the final sacrifice Jesus made to redeem the sins of the people and fulfill the God's judgment through the New Covenant. We'll also explore the temporal nature of Old Covenant sacrifices and contrast them with the finality of Jesus' New Covenant sacrifice. We'll talk about why Jesus' sacrifice was the last sacrifice: one and done.
