

WEEK 10: How Do I Treat People?

Memory Verse: Leviticus 19:18 (CSB)

"Do not take revenge or bear a grudge against members of your community, but love your neighbor as yourself; I am the Lord."

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

SINGLES

1. How can the command to love our neighbors as ourselves be practically applied in your daily interactions with others as singles?
2. As a single, what challenges do you face in treating others with love and kindness? How can you overcome these challenges?
3. In a culture that often emphasizes self-centeredness, how can you actively demonstrate love and kindness toward those around you?

SINGLE PARENT

1. As single parents, how do you balance the demands of parenting with the command to love your neighbor as yourself?
2. What support or encouragement do you need from your church community in order to fulfill the commandment to love others?
3. In challenging times, how can you rely on your faith and the support of your church family to maintain a loving and forgiving attitude?

TEENS

1. How can you apply the principle of loving your neighbors in your interactions at school, with friends, and in your family relationships?
2. What challenges do you face in treating others with kindness, and how can your faith guide you in overcoming these challenges?
3. How can parents and the church community support you in living out the command to love others, especially in the midst of peer pressure and societal expectations?

YOUNG ADULT

1. In the transition to adulthood, how can you navigate relationships, work, and social interactions while keeping the command to love your neighbors in mind?
2. As you pursue career goals and personal aspirations, how can you balance ambition with a commitment to loving others?
3. How can the church community support you in building meaningful relationships and living out the call to love your neighbors as themselves?

MARRIED COUPLES

1. In what practical ways can you exemplify the love commanded in Leviticus 19:18 in your homes and communities?
2. How can you navigate conflicts and disagreements while still adhering to the principle of treating others as themselves, as emphasized in Leviticus 19:18?
3. Discuss examples of mutual respect and consideration within a marriage, applying the idea of treating each other as you would like to be treated (Leviticus 19:18).

FAMILY

1. How can you intentionally create an atmosphere of love and respect, reflecting the command in Leviticus 19:18?
2. In what ways can your family members support each other through challenges, keeping in mind the principle of treating others as oneself from Leviticus 19:18?
3. Discuss the role of forgiveness and reconciliation in family life, drawing on the guidance of Leviticus 19:18.

WIDOWED

1. Considering the challenges faced by widows or widowers, how do you think the church community actively demonstrate love and support as instructed in Leviticus 19:18?
2. How has your idea of the resurrection changed over time?
3. How might you find comfort and strength in your faith, applying the teachings of Leviticus 19:18 in your daily life?

GEM PARENTS

1. In what ways can the church come alongside you, embodying the love commanded in Leviticus 19:18?
2. What has your child taught you about this verse?
3. How can you as a GEM parent apply the idea of selfless love in your caregiving responsibilities, drawing inspiration from Leviticus 19:18?

NEWLYWEDS

1. How can you establish a foundation of love and respect in your marriage, reflecting the teachings of Leviticus 19:18?
2. Discuss the importance of communication and understanding in the early stages of marriage, incorporating the command to love others as oneself (Leviticus 19:18).
3. In what ways can the church community support and mentor you in your journey of building a Christ-centered marriage, guided by Leviticus 19:18?

EMPTY NESTERS

1. In what ways can you redirect your focus on serving others and the community, applying the principle of love from Leviticus 19:18?
2. Discuss the challenges and opportunities that you face in maintaining strong, Christ-centered relationships, guided by Leviticus 19:18.
3. How can the church provide fellowship and purpose for you, encouraging you to continue living out the command of treating others as you want to be treated (Leviticus 19:18)?

DIVORCED

1. Explore ways in which the church can offer love and healing to individuals going through divorce, aligning with the command in Leviticus 19:18.
2. Discuss the challenges of forgiveness and grace in the context of divorce, considering the teachings of Leviticus 19:18.
3. How can divorced individuals cultivate a spirit of love and kindness in your interactions with others, guided by the principle of treating people as you want to be treated (Leviticus 19:18)?

GOLDEN SAINTS

1. Explore how you can continue to contribute to the church community, embodying the love emphasized in Leviticus 19:18.
2. Discuss the role of mentorship and wisdom-sharing among Golden Saints of the church, in alignment with the principle of treating others with love (Leviticus 19:18).
3. How can the church create a supportive environment for you, honoring your experiences and contributions, as instructed in Leviticus 19:18?
